## WHAT TO BRING:

- Bible
- Pen/Pencil
- Bedding (Sleeping bag/twin sheets, pillow, blanket, etc.)
- Water bottle
- Wristwatch
- Toiletries
- Towels (at least 2)
- Sunscreen/Bugspray
- Modest clothing for 6 days (see dresscode)
- Closed toed shoes (required for some activities)
- Swimsuit (see: dresscode)
- Spending money for concessions.

## WHAT NOT TO BRING:

- Immodest Clothing
- Alcohol
- Tobacco/Vapes
- Drugs
- Weapons
- Prank materials
- Expensive electronics
- Bad Attitudes



Medicine Policy

If you are bringing prescription medicine to camp, follow these instructions:

- Put the medicine in a Ziploc bag with your (or your student's) name on it.
- Include a notecard or sheet of paper with any specific directions for the medicine.
- Turn your medicine in to the designated sponsor at camp check in.

We will have a designated sponsor that will be in charge of medicine throughout the week of camp. All students needing to take medicine will go to that sponsor to get their medicine as needed.

The only prescription meds students may keep with them are an emergency inhaler, epipen, or other similar emergency medicine.

DO NOT bring over the counter meds such as TUMS, TYLONOL, etc. These will be available among our first aid supplies, also to be dispensed by designated sponsors.



We have a phone checkout policy at camp. When we arrive, students must check in their phone. Phones will be stored in a secure location throughout the day. Every evening, after service (from 9-10pm), students can go to the designated sponsor and check out their phones. They will have an hour to call home or take pictures before they must check their phone back in. If parents need to contact their student during "non-phone" hours, they need to use the contact numbers provided in this packet.



## **GENERAL GUIDELINES:**

- Shoes must be worn at all times outside the cabin.
- Apparel may not display or promote tobacco, alcohol, controlled substances, or inappropriate language or pictures.
- Undergarments must always be covered by outer garments.
- Midriffs should always be covered.
- No spaghetti strap shirts or dresses.
- No tank tops.
- No short shorts. At a minimum shorts must extend to, or just beyond, the camper's fingertips.
- No tight fitting or revealing clothing. This includes leggings or similar attire, which cannot be worn as pants.
- Girls may wear dresses/skirts, but they must reach the top of the knee.

## SWIMMING:

- Girls should wear modest, one-piece swim suits. Males should not wear tight fitting swim suits.
- While going to and from the swimming areas, all campers must wear shoes; males must wear a shirt and females must wear a covering over their swim suits.



- Be on time! Follow the provided schedule.
- Stealing, abuse, or pranks will not be tolerated in any form.
- No profanity or cruel language.
- No contraband items such as: weapons, drugs, cigarettes, vapes, alcohol, etc.
- No PDA (Public Displays of Affection).
- No girls in boys' dorms, and no boys in girls' dorms.
- Respect sponsors and other students.
- Students must stay in groups of at least 3 people FROM OUR CHURCH while going around the campgrounds.

BY REGISTERING FOR CAMP, CAMPERS AND THEIR PARENTS AGREE THAT CAMPERS WILL ABIDE BY THE RULES GIVEN BY FBC HENNESSEY. FAILURE TO ABIDE BY THESE RULES MAY RESULT IN THE OFFENDING CAMPER BEING SENT HOME FROM CAMP.
